During the time of the inspection, licensing specialist observed that the required alarm system did not work in both of the vehicles used to transport the children enrolled at the facility.

According to the DCF facility handbook 2.5 transportation. Pursuant to the Child Safety Alarm bill in 2021, all vehicles used to transport children by child care facilities and large family child care homes must be equipped with a reliable alarm system which prompts the driver to inspect the vehicle for children before exiting the vehicle.

12-01 Areas of the facility were found to be in need of cleaning. CCF Handbook, Section 3.1, A (Section 10, number 1) Physical Environment [SR]

Comments

During the time of the inspection, licensing specialist observed that both vehicles used to transport the children in care had empty water bottles, food wrappers on the floors in between the rows of seats. The seats of the vehicles had old spill stains on multiple seats.

According to the DCF facility handbook 3 Physical Environment

Children are much more susceptible to the adverse effects of environmental factors, materials and toxicants. It is imperative that the child care environment is conducive to the healthy development of children.

3.1 General Health and Safety Requirements

A. All child care facilities must be clean, in good repair, free from health and safety hazards and from evidence of, or presence of, vermin infestation. Indoor play areas

must be inspected daily for basic health and safety and documented on a daily inspection log. Outdoor play areas must be inspected daily for basic health and safety.

Any problems must be corrected before the play area is used by children. Documentation of the indoor play area inspection must be maintained for 12 months.

During the time of the inspection, licensing specialist monitored chipped paint on the walls throughout the facility, as well as the wall outside that the school age children enrolled use to hang their backpacks. The ceiling tiles have water stains, dirt and debris. The ceiling vents and filter were dirty with debris.

According to the DCF Facility Handbook, it is the responsibility of the director/operator to ensure all areas and equipment of the facility are free from fire hazards, such as lint build up in heating and air vents, filters, exhaust fans, ceiling fans, and dryer vents. This includes grease build-up in ovens, stoves and food equipment.

During the time of the inspection licensing specialist observed that the outlets were not covered in the 2 years old classroom.

According to the DCF Facility Handbook, All accessible electrical outlets must be tamper-resistant electrical outlets that

contain internal shutter mechanisms to prevent children from sticking objects into receptacles. In settings that do not have tamper-resistant electrical outlets, outlets

shall have safety covers.

During the time of the inspection the 18 inch separation was not met in all 7 classrooms.

According to the DCF Facility Handbook 3.6.2 Nap/Sleep Space, each child care program must include a designated area where each child can sit quietly or lie down to rest or nap.

B. When not in use, napping space and indoor floor space may be used interchangeably as indoor floor space.

C. A minimum of 18 inches must be maintained around individual napping and sleeping spaces. A maximum of two sides of a napping or sleeping space may

be against a solid barrier, such as the wall. The solid side of a crib does not meet the requirements for a solid barrier.

D. Napping and sleeping spaces must not be under furniture or against furniture that creates a hazard.

E. Napping and sleeping areas must not be in exit areas. All exits must remain clear in accordance with fire safety requirements

Comments

During the time of the inspection all of the fire extinguishers in the facility and in the 2 vehicles used to transport children were tagged December 2022. The extinguisher in vehicle #1 was leaking powder from the hose of the canister.

According to the DCF Facility Handbook, 3.8.2 Fire Safety

A. Unless statutorily exempted, all child care facilities must conform to state standards adopted by the State Fire Marshal, Chapter 69A36, F.A.C., Uniform

Standards for Life Safety and Fire Prevention in Child Care Facilities. A copy of the current and approved annual fire inspection report completed by a certified fire inspector must be on file with the licensing authority. If the program is granted a fire inspection exemption by the local fire inspection office, the exemption must be documented and maintained on file at the program.

B. Fire extinguishers with a minimum rating of 2A10BC must be properly installed, serviced and maintained with current inspection tags at all times.

During the time of the inspection 4 swings were not safely anchored to the frame. One swing was missing the bolt that attaches the seat of the swing to the chain.

According to the DCF Facility Handbook, 3.12 Outdoor Equipment

A. A child care facility must provide and maintain enough usable equipment suitable to each child's age and development and of a quantity for each to be involved in activities.

B. All playground equipment must be securely anchored, unless portable or stationary by design, in good repair, maintained in safe and sanitary condition, and placed to ensure safe use by the children. Maintenance must include inspections conducted every month of all supports above and below the ground and of all connectors and moving parts. Documentation of maintenance inspections must be maintained for 12 months.

C. All equipment, fences, and objects on the facility's premises shall be free from sharp, broken and jagged edges, and properly placed to prevent overcrowding or safety hazards in any one area.

D. Permanent or stationary playground equipment must have a fall/use zone that extends a minimum of 6 feet in all directions from the perimeter of the equipment. All types of ground cover must be maintained to provide resilience and reduce the incidence of injuries to children in the event of falls.

1. If the ground cover in place is loose ground cover (such as, but not limited to: mulch, shredded rubber chips, or sand) a minimum of 6 inches in depth is required in the use zone. Asphalt, concrete, hard packed dirt, hay, grass or leaves are unsuitable for use in the use zone area.

authorization must be dated and signed by the custodial parent or legal guardian and contain the child's name; the name of the medication to be given; and date, time and

amount of the correct dosage to be given. Prescription and non-prescription medications that are used on an as needed basis require the parent/ legal guardian

to provide additional documentation on the authorization form to describe symptoms that would require the medication to be given.

Communicable Disease Control

REMINDER: There are three common modes of transmission for the spread of microorganisms in childcare settings: contact, droplet, and airborne. Many common infections encountered in the childcare setting are transmitted by direct or indirect contact. Child Care facilities shall develop a written exposure plan regarding universal safety precautions, recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), to follow in the event there is exposure to blood and potentially infectious fluids. Personnel are required to be educated on the facility's exposure plan regarding standard precautions before beginning to work and annually thereafter. Written documentation that childcare personnel have participated in the facility's annual refresher education for the exposure plan and understand the proper procedures in the event there is exposure to blood, and potentially infectious fluids must be retained for 12 months and be available for licensing to review.

CCF In-Service

REMINDER: In-service training for 2023/2024 fiscal year must be completed before June 30, 2024. Counselor reviewed 10 hours of annual in-service, completed, for all child care personnel for the 2022/2023 fiscal year.

Important School Readiness Updates:

Due to changes in federal regulations, there are new health and safety training requirements for all child care personnel employed at a contracted School Readiness (SR) program site. For compliance, all personnel who directly supervise children must successfully complete mandated health and safety training.

By June 30, 2024, all current SR child care personnel must complete two new health and safety courses: Health and Nutrition in the School Readiness Program and Safety Practices in the School Readiness Program. These courses are free to the learner and will be hosted in the Florida Early Childhood Professional Development Registry.

Within 90 days of initial employment with any SR provider, new hires and current pre-service trainees must complete all required pre-service training by successfully completing one of the options below:

Option 1 (DCF courses, plus corresponding exams)

Existing courses available now under the Child Care Facility Part 1 heading for \$10 per course:

Health, Safety and Nutrition (8 hours)

Child Growth and Development (6 hours)

Behavioral Observation and Screening (6 hours)

Identifying and Reporting Child Abuse and Neglect (4 hours)

PLUS

Health and Nutrition in the School Readiness Program (4 hours)

Safety Practices in the School Readiness Program (5 hours)

OR

Option 2 (DEL Florida Early Childhood PD Registry)

New courses available under the School Readiness Pre-Service heading for free:

Child Development in the School Readiness Program (4 hours)

Health and Nutrition in the School Readiness Program (4 hours)

Safe Sleep Practices in Child Care (2 hours; not required for school-age only programs)

Safety Practices in the School Readiness Program (5 hours)

Transportation Safety in Child Care Programs (2 hours; if applicable)

Please note, SR child care personnel with exemptions from completing the DCF introductory child care training based on educational credentials or passing of competency examinations per s. 402.305(2), F.S., must also complete all mandated pre-service training in option 1 or option 2 by June 30, 2024, or within 90 days of initial employment.
